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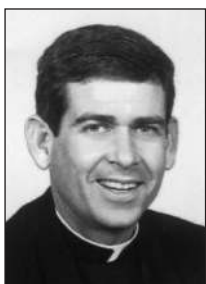
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Fr. Scott's Corner



Every so often, I think about a story about an elderly woman who could no longer live by herself and was moving into an assisted-living nursing home. When asked how she felt about the move by a social worker at the nursing home, she said that she was excited about her new living arrangement. She explained that she knew she would be content with it.

The social worker was surprised by her response. She said, “But you haven’t even seen the place. How can you know that you’ll be happy there?”

The elderly woman responded, “I knew that I had to make the move, so I told myself that I was going to be happy and content in my new home. And I will be.”

We can learn a great deal from this woman. How we feel about and live our life is affected by the attitude we bring to it. It is in our control: we can choose to be happy, or we can choose to complain. So often, our feelings have much to do with our choices and our attitude.

You’ve probably heard the question “is your glass half empty or half full?” How would you answer this question? To me, as Christians, our answer should always be the same—half full. Half full is the positive, hope-filled response. And as Christians, are we not to be both positive and hopeful people?

Throughout our lives, we are tested by both negative things and people. I think we all know someone who seems to live perpetually under a dark cloud and always see the bad side of situations. It’s far too easy to be dragged down by these kinds of people!

Jesus experienced his share of naysayers, too. He too knew people who refused to see possibility or were so jaded by life that they were unable to live with hope. Instead, they chose defeat, loss, and discouragement.

As Christians, we believe that Jesus brings life into death, hope to despair, light into darkness. As followers of the Lord, we are to be people of encouragement, people of hope and promise, and people who see great possibilities even in very difficult situations. We know that death does not have the last word. How fortunate that our Christian faith reminds us over and over again that God, who is life, and love, always has the first and last word. It is in God we trust!

As we gather to celebrate the Eucharist together this month nourished by the very presence of Christ, the Lord of life, let us continue to pray for one another. May we view all things in our life as being at least half full! Let us pray that we might keep a hope-filled attitude while we live our daily lives.

This month, as you worship with us as a member of our faith community, know that you have a place in the prayers of the Mercy Home family. I pray the time we spend together strengthens your faith and continues to give you hope.

Jaylen was too embarrassed to tell anyone what life was really like at home. And he was really good at pretending like everything was okay all the time.

But things were far from okay. Jaylen's father had been laid off from his job months ago, and with his job went a lot of the family's income. His mother began working two jobs to try and make ends meet, but there never seemed to be enough money for all the bills.

To make matters worse, Jaylen's father, depressed and ashamed to be out of work, seemed to completely give up on trying to find a new job. He spent most of his time on the couch, watching TV with a blank look on his face. He tried to hide it from Jaylen's family, but they all knew that he drank a lot after he thought everyone was asleep.

Because money was so tight, Jaylen's parents began to have to make decisions about what bills to pay. Sometimes there wasn't enough money to pay for groceries after paying the utility bills. Other times, the electricity or heat would be shut off. His father always seemed to find money for alcohol, however.

Even though Jaylen was scared and stressed about everything going on, he tried to hide his worries from his mother, knowing that she, too, was stressed out. His friends' lives seemed perfect compared to his, and he was too ashamed to share with them what was actually going on.

Jaylen was too young to get a job to help out his mother, so he decided to help out by taking care of as many household chores as he could, especially because his father was not helping out at all. He began neglecting his schoolwork and focused his attention on cooking, cleaning, doing laundry, and even paying bills.

Jaylen had always been a good student, so his teachers were concerned when they noticed his grades dropping. A few tried to talk to him and find out what was going on, but Jaylen brushed aside their concerns.

But fortunately, his math teacher continued to check in with him. She knew that Jaylen had big academic dreams and didn't want him to fall too far behind.

Eventually, Jaylen couldn't hide that something was going on at home. He was exhausted, his stomach hurt constantly from anxiety and stress, and his grades were dropping quickly. So when his math teacher inquired, again, about his home life, Jaylen couldn't help but let the whole story out.

His teacher was understanding and offered Jaylen a possible solution. She had heard from her parish priest about a place called Mercy Home and explained that it was a place where Jaylen would be safe, free from worries about money, and where he could focus on his schoolwork and future. She said she would help him connect with us if that was what Jaylen wanted to do.

Jaylen was nervous about leaving his home but knew it was the only solution that would help him get his life back on track. He agreed to give our Home a try.

Things turned around quickly once Jaylen moved in. Used to keep everything inside, he was relieved to have a therapist to share his concerns with. He also enjoyed having other boys around who had gone through similar struggles and could empathize with him.

In addition to helping Jaylen, Mercy Home also provided his family with resources to help his parents get back on her feet. The whole family participated in therapy regularly together, which helped, too.

Today, Jaylen's grades are back on track, and he is now looking toward his future with hope, not fear. Thank you for allowing us to change the lives of kids like Jaylen. It makes all the difference!
